About the webinar series

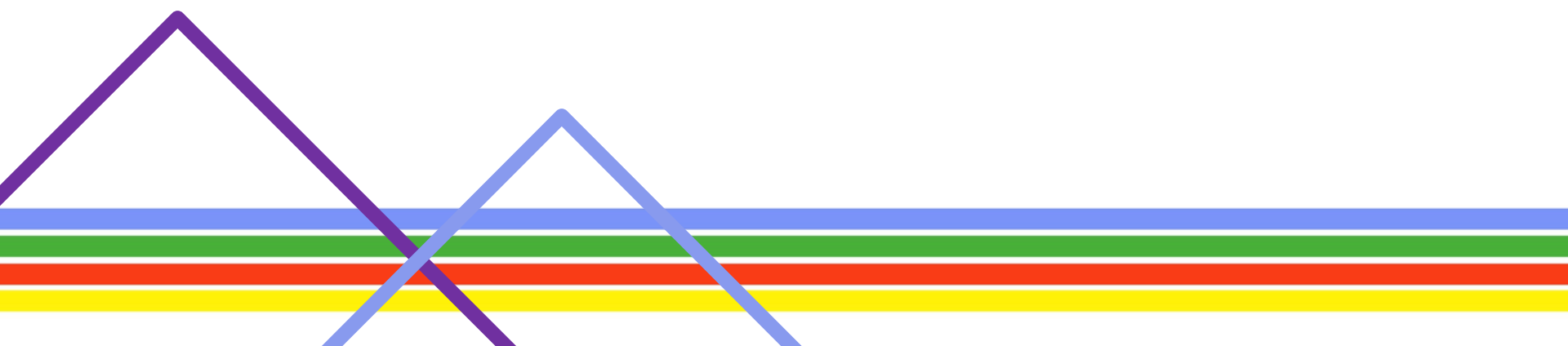
The **Evidence 2023 Capacities webinar series** aims to:
