



Broad overview of the webinar

- Capacity strengthening entails people, institutions, and systemic level strengthening in establishing, adapting, and maintaining sustainable EIDM capacity, as outlined in the Manifesto on Capacity Development for EIDM in Africa.
- To accomplish this, it is essential to develop the abilities of both individuals and groups to create or improve institutional structures, systems and procedures to achieve better outcomes.
- Comprehending the various processes that are involved in relation to the different actors in the evidence ecosystem is, therefore, critical.
- A nuanced understanding of these processes can foster equity and inclusiveness in formulating interventions for capacity strengthening.






